

9/10/10 SUNN, HAMMOND AND MCDOW GRAB WINS ON CANAAN DIRT

Courtyard By Marriott hosted the final regular season event on the Canaan Dirt Speedway surface for 2010, and a fine event it was. Winners for the night included Josh Sunn, Dallas Hammond and Mickey McDow.

Josh Sunn wrapped up the 2010 Napa Mini Stock championship in fine fashion as he cruised to an easy win over Taylor Fletcher and Leon Dugan. Dugan captured the qualifying checkers.

The Bond Auto Parts Bandits wrapped up their regular season with a 50 lap event paying \$300 to win. Rookie driver Dallas Hammond had been knocking on victory lanes door all season long, and on Friday night he rolled to his first win of his career in the biggest event of the season. Armand Boucher was second followed by JP Vaillancourt, Mike Stender and Matt Boucher. Leon Dugan won the preliminary round. Dugan also captured the 2010 Bandit championship.

The big \$1,000 to win Enduro saw 35 cars roll to the grid for 100 laps. After all the dust settled it was Mickey McDow grabbing the big pay check. Richard Licence, Clint Labine, Donnie Lashua, and Doug Boucher rounded out the top five. Finishing sixth through tenth were Roland Bigelow, Kevin Dickinson, Ryan Christian, Shawn Travis, and Jeremiah Stearns.

Canaan Dirt Speedway will wrap up their 2010 season on Friday, September 17th with the “War of the Worlds” event sponsored by Ricky’s Race For Kids and Wicked Racing Products. The Mods will race for 50 laps paying the winner a cool \$1,000 to win. The Super Streets will race 30 laps paying the winner \$300, and the Bandits will race 25 laps paying the winner \$250. All cars must be legal for either Canaan Dirt Speedway, Bear Ridge Speedway or Big Daddy’s Speedbowl to be eligible to compete. There will also be a combined four and six cylinder Demolition Derby paying the winner \$500. Post time is 7pm. Pits open at 4pm and grandstands open at 5pm. Admission prices for this event are Adults \$12, Sr. & Teens \$10, Kids 11 & under are free. Pit admission is \$30.
