Another great night of racing is in the books at Canaan Dirt Speedway as the season winds down with championship week lying dead ahead, this coming Friday night. Winners on S.K. Bean's Enfield garage and Sherwin Williams Paint Stores night included Randy Howe, Derek O'Hearn, Allan Hammond, Doug Boucher and Mitchell Davis.

Nineteen Papa Z's Modifieds rolled into the pit area to take on the track that some say is too hard to tame. DJ Robinson and Ed Tobin brought the field to green with Robinson getting the jump. Cautions flew early and regularly in the first seven laps as Mark Williams took over the point before handling woes sent him backwards. In the mean time, Randy Howe, whom started 16th on the grid worked his way to the front bringing Robbie Lacroix and Joey Scarborough along for the ride. Lacroix made a last ditch effort to get by Howe but came up a few feet short. Scarborough, Dan Eastman and Travis Shinn completed the top five. Trevor Rocke, Howe and Williams won their respective qualifiers.

Allan Hammond made a bold move on lap six to take the lead and cruise to victory in the Mirror lake Rod & Custom Late Models. Dale Morse and Dan Collins finished second and third, followed by Brian Sousa and Adam Kimball. Collins won the preliminary round.

Derek O'Hearn made it two wins in a row in the Beard Sewer and Drain Super Streets as he outdistanced Mark Brown, Robbie Williams, Ryan Christian and Todd Buckwold. Ironically for Brown, his car shutdown at the start/finish line and had to be pushed to victory lane. Brown won the lone qualifier.

Doug Boucher picked up his second win of 2011 in the Bond Auto Parts Bandits as he held off Matt Boucher, Armand Boucher, Tony Shaw and Mark St. Pierre. Shaw had second place wrapped up until he bobbed on turn four letting two cars pass him at the stripe. Matt Boucher won the heat race.

The always entertaining NAPA Bombers put on their usual exciting show with lots of action the entire 20 lap distance. Mitchell Davis carried the checkered flag, followed by Ryan Avery, James Davis, Matt Lashua and Armand Boucher. This was the final Bomber event before next week's \$1,000 to win Enduro.

Next Friday night will see Hinkley Oil Company of Claremont present championship night at Canaan. On the cards will be Round #3 of the Subway Triple Crown Series for the Modifieds. There will be Triple Crown points and track championship points for this event. Also racing for championships will be Late Models, Super Streets, Bandits and the \$1,000 to win Bomber Enduro.
